GLORY TO GOOD

Comparison may keep you on the sidelines, but we ALL have a specific purpose different from each other in order that together, we can fulfill the mission of the church. Use your gifts, talents, resources, abilities, and passions to serve God faithfully. When you do this, you will glorify God, shine the light of Jesus to the world, encourage your fellow Christians, and make an impact on the generations to come. Never underestimate the power of our God at work within you. He has, is, and will continue to use imperfect, broken people to accomplish His perfect will. In our faithfulness, we reflect Jesus and His sacrifice. See the cross.

ENCOURAGE OTHER CHRISTIANS BY EXAMPLE

If you feel worthless and unworthy to do God's will, read your Bible for inspiration and encouragement. Noah was a drunk, Abraham was afraid and impatient, Jacob was a liar, Moses made excuses and lost his temper, Rahab was a prostitute, Gideon was the weakest in a small family and fearfully doubted, David was a murderer and an adulterer, Ruth was a poor widow in a foreign land, the disciples were unschooled sinners, Peter denied Jesus three times, and Paul murdered Christians. Yet all of these people and more like them were used by God to further His kingdom. These ordinary people were just like you and me, but they were faithful to God and obeyed His calling. God gave them strength to do incredible things to accomplish His will. How will God use you? We can only be faithful each day and leave that up to Him. Your impact on one person can influence generations to come. Be faithful today so that God will be praised tomorrow.

SHINE YOUR LIGHT TO THE WORLD THROUGH LOVE

GENERATIONAL IMPACT

This summer, I have witnessed God at work in a number of people and in a variety of ways. Old and young, male and female, children and adults, all faithful to God, using their gifts to serve Him. I saw puzzle makers leading kids to Jesus through games they created. I witnessed lifeguards teaching kids how to swim, I watched nurses treat the sick, VBS volunteers decorate rooms and share Jesus with children, teens served cleaning closets, painting houses for the needy, packing meals for the hungry, caring for cancer patients, and encouraging the widows. I tasted delicious desserts made by the elderly, learned an old VBS song from a widow, and used vbs props (created thirty years ago by a former member now living overseas) to teach a memory verse to children. I watched a dad publicly bless his daughter at her wedding, heard a sermon about changing my heart, was led in song by young and old song leaders that lifted my spirit, and encouraged to show compassion by an intern. God is working in all of us. Let's give Him praise by our faithfulness.
