How many times have we read a scripture, skimming over it without really giving it a second thought to realize what it means? I think if we are honest with ourselves, we can all say that we have at one time or another.

Philippians 4:7 reads, "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." I know and understand the meaning of peace, that being the reconciliation we have with God through the sacrifice of Jesus...that good standing we have with God because of His love for us and our response to that love. The phrase "transcends all understanding" has always piqued my attention but never enough to investigate or study it more. My own personal experience has taught me what that phrase means.

Eighteen months ago, in the span of less than a month, I had surgery on my right knee, was diagnosed with Covid, and suffered a stroke as a result of Covid, all while moving to the Houston area. To say my world was rocked is a gross understatement.

I can tell you I have never spent so much time in private prayer and reflection. I received many phone calls, texts, cards or letters, and words of comfort and encouragement. For about a month, I was not allowed physical contact with anyone other than medical professions and therapists, so I had a lot of alone time. One of those I was allowed to visit with was a psychologist in the rehab facility. During one of our last visits, he asked me if I was concerned about the possibility of dying because of the stroke. I can tell you, I was struck and taken aback by his question. As a Christian, death is something I contemplate on a regular basis but not something I dwell on. In my life I have had many medical issues to deal with, and all of them I have been able to overcome rather quickly and been able to return to my regular routine. At no time did I ever consider the possibility that I would die because of this issue. It just never entered my mind. I had physically and spiritually felt those prayers offered on my behalf, and I was comforted by that. There was not any big spiritual revelation, just the calm knowledge that things were going to be okay. I felt I was too young to be dealing with this issue and my overall question was how long it was going to take me to get back on my feet. I was blessed to have good doctors, nurses and therapists who were not only good in their professions but also people who took an interest in me as a person beyond just the medical issue they were treating. One doctor told me early on, because of the type of stroke I had suffered I was lucky to be alive. My immediate response was to tell him "No, I am blessed."

The greatest thing that has come out of this situation has been the opportunity to share my hope in Christ with some I may never have had the opportunity to witness to. When I was initially transferred by helicopter from Jourdanton to San Antonio, I was taken out of the helicopter in San Antonio. I could feel the warm sun and the cool breeze of the day and I commented on that to the crew of Life Flight. One of the doctors laughed, slapped me on the arm and said I was going to be fine.

So many people I have known have let physical ailments get in the way of their spiritual lives. While physical infirmities can hinder our service, we cannot let them stop us. I so appreciate David's constant admonitions to us in his sermons ... Don't quit ... Don't stop ... Don't give up. While Amy and I were so intimately involved with the Pleasanton congregation, and really did not have a church home, it was so reassuring of God's love for us in the Memorial congregation in response to our needs.

I try to keep a positive attitude and have to admit I have often fallen short but my trying to be a good example has been able to get me through many down times. Staying in touch with good people of like mind has lifted me up more times than I care to admit. The fellowship of God is unlike any other in this world. Romans 8:35 asks the question, "Who can separate us from the love of Christ?" The answer to that is no one or nothing, so long as we do not allow ourselves to be separated.


