


NOVEMBER 21, 2021

Growing up, one of my favorite movies was Pollyanna.

The main character, Pollyanna, is taught by her father how to play "the glad game." The goal is to find something about everything to be "glad" about, whether it's a disappointing Christmas gift or life-long illness. "The glad game" reminds me of Romans 8:28 - "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." God uses all things for good - even things like critical illness.

I have gastroparesis. In the fall of 2019, my gastroparesis became life-threatening and I had to survive from an IV bag for 2 years. God blessed us with life-saving treatment in March of 2021. During the low times of my illness, however, we found ourselves playing "the glad game." We found the good within a challenging season where God placed us. Here are just a few of the good things and lessons that came from that time:

• Ask for prayer & accept help from the church community. I would not be as healthy as I am today without your prayers. Memorial is a powerful praying community; the amount of prayers, cards, and people that continue to reach out to us is so humbling. We are forever grateful for the love and support of the Memorial family, our Sunday school group, and small group. We are so blessed! If you are struggling, be vulnerable and ask for prayer and lean on your church

• The journey itself holds a valuable lesson. Pay attention to the work that God is doing right now in the current season of your life. Often we would get frustrated and ask God why I was so sick for so long. Ultimately, we knew deep down that we were each being broken and remolded in His image. Now, I know that our faith is stronger. Our marriage is stronger. We are individually better people - still very flawed, but better. We are thankful for the journey.

God's plan is greater than our plan. This one I still struggle with. I am not "perfect better" like I thought I would be. But I am better, and my healing is all His glory and His miracle, which I should not diminish with my flawed expectations. I want to be normal and raise a family and have milestones just like any other girl my age. But God's timing and plan is better than mine and He is preparing my heart.

I am so grateful for each and every one of you. I am so thankful for the Memorial congregation. I am so thankful for my healing. I am so thankful that I can now serve and be there for others as you have for Jon and me. We love y'all and praise God for you. Philippians 1:3
