past month. We are working with six other ones who will soon have their leaders with God's help. We have two evangelism teams working in Mexico, and many more in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic. We continue with Ladies' leadership training holding area wide workshops. We had these in the Dominican Republic and the Los Angeles, CA area recently. Roberto Benitez and Armando Artiga, with help from very generous members are now helping to build several buildings for the church to meet, primarily in Ecuador, Southern Colombia and El Salvador. An example of this is in Urcuqui, Ecuador, a little village 1/2 hour from Ibarra. The church was started at the end of last year, and by March this year they had 28 members. They were meeting in someone's house. A brother from Dallas bought them a piece of land, we helped with the foundation, others put up the rest. Robert and Armando took care of the permits and legal work. Now they have a place to meet

with a metal roof, walls and floor. They have about 35 attending. Sandro, a graduate of the Quito school of preaching goes there 4 evenings a week and Sunday because he works for a living in Atuntaqui. May God bless you richly for your continued help and involvement. We are very Robert & Jane thankful.
